This month I also had the opportunity to go to Cotui. Pastor Bonifacio is a national pastor that started a work there with the help of missionary Wesley Lane. Together he and I went and handed out gospel tracts. During our visiting we encountered one man named Nelson who claimed to be a believer and came with us back to church. He and Pastor Bonifacio had a lenghty conversation and Nelson declared his intention to become a member.

I also winessed something else that day that will stick with me for a long time. As we walked up on a group of people in the street, one man who was obviously high on something asked us to read to him from the Scriptures. Pastor Bonafacio opened up the Bible and began to witness to him and the others. The man quickly began shouting at us that what we were teaching was wrong. As I stood there and watched Pastor Bonafacio preach, Isaiah 58:1 came to my heart. "Cry aloud, spare not..." The louder the man shouted the louder Pastor Bonafacio preached. When he finished preaching, with the man still shouting he said "thank you and have a good day." As far as I know no one accepted Christ that day, but they heard because God's man lifted up his voice and spared not.

Canvasing the Community

This month we also had a group from Calvary Baptist Church in Baltimore, MD come and help us canvas our community with invitations to the church here in Jarabacoa. They handed out countless numbers of invites and tracts across 4 barrios here. We have already begun seeing fruit from this effort with several new people coming to worship service and youth. It was very surreal to me as I stood watching the group one day, because it wasn't long ago, I was a teenager handing out flyers in Mexico. Now I'm standing on a corner in the Dominican Republic watching the next generation of teenagers and I'm the "full time" missionary.
